	The PHE Influenza like Illness (ILI) case definition for use in care homes is as follows:						
	<ul> <li>Oral or tympanic temperature ≥37.8°C</li> <li>AND one of the following:</li> </ul>						
	acute onset of at least one of the following respiratory symptoms: cough (with or without sputum), hoarseness, nasal discharge or congestion, shortness of breath, sore throat, wheezing, sneezing OR						
4a	<ul> <li>an acute deterioration in physical or mental ability without other known cause.</li> </ul>	Prescribing clinician					
	Alternatively, a laboratory detection of influenza virus would fulfil the definition of a case of influenza.  It is acknowledged that older persons may not always develop a fever with influenza; if an influenza outbreak is suspected due to respiratory symptoms or acute deterioration in physical or mental ability without fever, prompt laboratory testing is recommended to confirm the diagnosis.  Ideally, treatment should begin within 48 hours of onset of symptoms  Appropriate respiratory samples should be taken.

4b	Prescribers need to be clear if they are prescribing for treatment in a patient who has symptoms or chemoprophylaxis for patients that are non-symptomatic but have been exposed to the virus.  Prescribers will need to discuss this with the health protection team leading the response. The dose for each indication is different.  It is <a href="ESSENTIAL">ESSENTIAL</a> that the prescribing Clinician assess the patients' renal function (eGFR) prior to prescribing treatment, and adjust the dose accordingly, please refer to the BNF or SPC for dosing in renal impairment.  If an individual has a documented renal function within the last 6 months, which does not indicate renal impairment, the standard dose of antivirals can be prescribed.	Prescribing Clinician					
	For individuals with a known renal impairment and where the prescriber has access to their renal function during an emergency outbreak, they can be prescribed an adjusted dose according to the guidelines.

	However, in an emergency outbreak response, where there is no information about the presence or absence of renal impairment (or lack of available routine renal function results from the past 6 months), there is a high likelihood of abnormal renal function in care home residents, so it is recommended that a reduced daily dose of oseltamivir be used. This would be for a dose appropriate to CrCl of 31-60 mL/min.  Send the prescription via EPS to the nominated pharmacy ensuring SLS is visible on the script.  To avoid delay in treatment prescriptions could be directed to the NHSE stock holding pharmacies who carry stocks of oseltamivir 75mg and 30mg capsules all year round (refer to Appendix 1). The stock holding pharmacies will arrange transportation to the care home.
